Street Pride and Community Groups

August has been a relatively quiet month for Chatteris in Bloom / Street Pride in terms of focusing on new ventures. The group has continued to maintain existing projects and conduct litter picks.

The volunteers now eagerly await the Anglia in Bloom results which are announced on 12th September.

Environmental Health

Environmental Health have had a marked increase in the number of pest control complaints received over the summer period.

Pests such as rats and mice are very common in the summer as food is often left out on barbeques or in unlidded bins which attract the rodents to the food and into and around domestic homes. In all cases advice to residents has resolved the issues.

Fly tipping

The total number of fly tipping instances recorded for July 2018 is 150. This, broken down into areas, is as follows:

- Chatteris –9
- March 9
- Whittlesey 19
- Wisbech 51
- Villages 62
- Total 150

The majority of the fly tipping was household related, with 90 instances. 11 were of green waste, 15 were vehicle related, and 8 electrical related.

8 of the Chatteris fly tips were investigated but no evidence found.

3 warning letters have been sent where investigations are on-going or there was insufficient evidence to take the case further.

Enforcement actions this month

Our proactive enforcement patrols have been carried out in and around Fenland. With the warmer summer months we have been carrying out extra patrols for street drinking in Wisbech. During August a total of 87 tickets have been issued. This can be broken down as follows:

- Whittlesey-2
- Wisbech-85

The type of litter is as follows:

- Litter-17
- PSPO alcohol related- 65
- Spitting-5

Dog Fouling Campaign

In early Autumn a new campaign will be launched across Fenland to address dog fouling issues and irresponsible dog ownership.

Streetscene Officers will be looking for community volunteers to support eh Green Ribbon Campaign. This Campaign is successfully run by other Councils. More information will follow separately in the coming weeks.

Abandoned and Nuisance Vehicles

- 20 vehicles have been reported as being abandoned across Fenland in August, with just 1 of these being located in Chatteris.
- 1 has been removed by our contractor

• 15 vehicles needed no further action – these were mainly parking issues- and the other 4 are still under investigation.

Other Street Scene Issues

- Warning letters were attached to commercial vans parking on a grass area, causing concern for other residents and damage to the surface.
- Overhanging greenery & brambles were reported in New Road details, and photos were forwarded to Cambridgeshire Highways for action as this is a regular occurrence.
- Excess litter is regularly found in the Fairleedes car park so additional litter picks were carried out by Street Scene officers. Horseway Drove also needed extra attention.
- The clothing bank in Furrowfields car park was overflowing so phoned through for an empty.
- A motorbike has been using Furrowfields Park as a short cut. Patrols have been carried out in an attempt to identify the rider and bike to ensure a safe environment for other park users.
- The Street Scene team have completed the first round of memorial safety inspections. They have carried out almost 24,000 inspections across all cemeteries and churchyards which FDC maintain across the Fenland area. These inspections are carried out on a 5 year rolling programme, to ensure visitors and staff are safe as they carry out their duties.
