

Old English to Modern English

Anthony Poulton-Smith is a freelance journalist and author, with 83 books, many articles, innumerable crosswords and puzzles published. He has been fascinated by the development of language and etymology.

This talk starts with the Saxons, Angles, Jutes and Frisians who arrived on our shores from the fifth century AD with a culture and language we refer to as Old English. Over the next 1,500 years influences principally from the Scandinavian and French tongues took this to Middle English and eventually to Modern English.

19/08/2022 Mrs Cromwell – 17th Century Cooking

Eleonora Gardner is a tour guide and public speaker working and residing in Ely. She is a certified Blue Badge East Anglian Tour Guide and holds a particular interest in the local area and 17th century English history.

She has a number of vibrant talks on East Anglian Life and characters – such as Oliver Cromwell, Samuel Pepys and Charles II. Today she is talking to us about 17th Century cooking and the foods in Mrs Cromwell's house. It will be a tasty trip through the culinary world of the Stuarts, from eel pie to the cakes that started the fire of London.



CHATTERIS MIDSUMMER FESTIVAL

Chatteris Midsummer Festival will return in all During the afternoon there will be an acoustic its full glory on the 25th and 26th June 2022 with the usual attractions plus some new ideas. The Festival will be held at Furrowfields Recreation Ground and the theme this year is Fairy Tales and Folklore. Entry to the showground will be just £1 each day.

The Festival will open each day at 10am and will be launched on the Saturday with the walking parade. It should be a lively, noisy and colourful parade with three bands (two samba and one drum corps), Morris dancers, cheerleaders and stilt walkers lining up with local groups, including schools and nurseries. It is not too late to sign up, just email <u>chatteriscouncil@btconnect.com</u>.

On the field the entertainers in the parade will perform in the arena along with the Dog and Duck Show which has appeared on TV and is very entertaining. There will be music in the marquee, a story teller, fun fair, inflatables, stalls and a fairy crown and dragon mask making workshop. During the afternoon there will be an acoustics session in the marquee and fun sports for the children. In the evening it is time for the Party in the Park with music from popular local band Scooted and Booted and a DJ set from Laura Dennis, who always keeps the crowds entertained.

On the Sunday there will be the dog show, the colour fun run (which was so popular last year), cream teas (with a magician), an animal experience and music from Isle 'ave a Shanty.

During the days browse amongst the stalls, enjoy the refreshments and let the youngsters join in the inflatables fun and enjoy the fairground rides.

It is a small (all female) committee who organise the Festival, with financial help from Chatteris Town Council and Fenland District Council, and we are looking for help. If you can commit please use the email address above to let us know.

NEW TOWN SIGN UNVEILED

Chatteris' smart new town sign was officially unveiled by the Mayor, Cllr Linda Ashley, in May.

The sign was created by Chatteris artist Mr Ric Savage who very kindly donated his time after Chatteris Town Council purchased the materials. Cllr Ashley thanked Mr Savage for his wonderful sign.

The original town sign was donated by the Women's Institute in 1977 to mark the Queen's Silver Jubilee. It has been replaced and refurbished four times and Cllr Ashley pointed out it is only fitting that the new sign should be unveiled in the Queen's Platinum Jubilee year.

The sign is located in Jubilee Gardens which have been refurbished as part of the Renaissance

Project. Street furniture and lampposts throughout the town centre have been re-painted, refurbished and replaced through the project which is part of the Growing Fenland scheme funded by the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority.

Businesses in the town centre are also able to apply for grants to smarten up their premises. For an application form they should contact the Town Council.

The aim of the Renaissance project is to help businesses and the town recover from the pandemic. It is hoped showing the town is cared for will help to attract more visitors and encourage local people to shop and dine in the town centre.

2ND CHATTERIS SCOUT GROUP



Chatteris has a thriving Scout Group running from our own Scout Hall in Victoria Street. Within the Group we have a Beaver Colony, for children aged between 6 and 8, a Cub Pack, for those aged 8 to $10 \frac{1}{2}$ and a Scout Troop for those between 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 14.

We wanted to let you know what our young people have been doing over the last few months so putting an article in Chatteris Centre Point was too good an opportunity to miss.

Over recent months we have been extremely lucky to have several people visit us to chat with our sections and we are very grateful for them giving up their time. Our Beavers have visited the church and spent time with Reverend Wendy, working on their Faith badge, they also had a visit from Amey, who talked to them about recycling and the Wildlife Trust also dropped in and did lots of activities with them. Our Cubs have been working on their First Aid badge so have had a visit from Dr Claude and from MAGPAS to help them with this. They also visited Chatteris Tennis Club and had a session with one of the coaches.

Our Scouts have tried their hand at some adaptations of sports in the Winter Olympics. They've also had a go at Archery, using sucker arrows and they have been learning different ways to light a fire as well as making tents from tarpaulin.

As I write this the final plans are being made to a Group Hike, which will involve all sections. The hike will take them between 3 and 4 hours and will give all those that take part the opportunity to move towards the next Hikes Away badge.

In July all our young people will have the opportunity to join up with other Scout Groups across our District, including Doddington, March, Wisbech, Thorney and Whittlesey, at a campsite in Thetford. There will be lots of different activities available for them all to take part in as well as giving them a chance to join a District Campfire before collapsing into their sleeping bags for a well-earned rest before getting stuck in again the following day.
